

In Phonics, the children have mastered new Phase 5 graphemes and 'tricky words' which is enhancing their reading and spelling skills.


Our Maths lessons have focused on additive structures, where children learnt different strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems involving 'first, then, now'.

In English, the children read *I Want My Hat Back* and *Billy and the Beast* and wrote creatively about their own imaginative beasts.

Our visit from Pavillion Dance gave the children the opportunity to take part in dance workshops that focused on a festivals theme. It was an absolute joy to watch all our children develop their dancing skills and perform a dance together.

We are all incredibly proud of the children's efforts and achievements this half term!

We are also excited to start swimming lessons in the spring term, adding another fun and valuable experience to the children's learning journey.



Year 2

It certainly has been another busy term in Year 2! The pupils have been learning about the physical and human features of beaches and coastlines in Geography and they were able to put this knowledge into action during a fieldwork trip to Bournemouth Beach. The weather was glorious for a December morning, and it was fantastic to see the pupils being able to identify the man made and natural features of our local coastline as well as discussing their impact on tourism. In preparation for the trip, we also welcomed the RNLI to the school who gave the children an interactive session on beach safety.

A highlight for me this term, has been our Art lessons, the children have learned all about creating tints and tones using paint and this culminated in the pupils creating some fantastic pieces of art based on the work of Swiss artist Paul Klee.

In English the children have created some phenomenal pieces of writing this term including a letter to our local MP, Jessica Toale, about endangered animals and a news report based on the book 'The House Held Up by Trees'. We have enjoyed the lead up to Christmas with the children and they are due a much-deserved rest over the break. We hope all the children and families of Year 2 have a peaceful Christmas break and we look forward to seeing you all again in 2025.

Year 3


It has been a very exciting term for Year 3, filled with engaging activities and new learning experiences.

The highlight of the term was undoubtedly Roman Day, where the children immersed themselves in the history and culture of ancient Rome whilst considering 'What the Romans have done for us'. The day was filled with activities and discussions. Thank you to Miss Broadway for organising such a fantastic day.

In addition to Roman Day, the children participated in a variety of Christmas-related activities, fostering a spirit of joy and celebration. A particular favourite was our class reading of Roald Dahl's classic, The BFG. The children thoroughly enjoyed crafting their own Snozzcumber recipes, allowing their imaginations to run wild. Furthermore, they developed their creative writing skills by composing their own versions of the story's opening, showcasing their unique voices and storytelling abilities.

In maths, we have continued to develop our understanding of numbers up to 1000, building a solid foundation for future learning. The progress the children have made is commendable.

Looking ahead to next term, we are excited about our swimming sessions, which will take place on Friday's (a timetable will be uploaded to ClassDojo and the Year 3 page of the school website). Additionally, we have a trip planned to the Church linking to our Religion and Worldview learning. We anticipate another term filled with fun, learning, and growth!



Year 4

Well done Year 4 for another great half term. We have really enjoyed learning more about Ancient Egypt. A particular highlight was mummifying a member of the class!

After Christmas we will be learning about the Tudors and Henry VIII, which ties in with our residential trip to Hooke Court from 5th-7th February.

Recently we have been studying perimeter in maths which has been great fun. We've loved reading four fantastic books in English: Farther, The Wild Robot, Until I Met Dudley and The Power of Flight.

Year 4 will continue to swim on a Wednesday next half term and have PE on a Monday. Please keep up the times tables practice - the children are making great progress!

Year 5






English

PTA




Sports in Talbot

I'm thrilled to share some exciting news! Talbot Primary School will be continuing with the popular Theatre Kidz club for the Spring term.

TPA Academy provides both curriculum support and after-school lessons in many primary schools. All our teachers are qualified specialists with extensive experience in both performing and teaching. Our goal in the Theatre Kidz classes is to encourage children to embrace their individuality and celebrate their achievements through learning in a fun, nurturing environment.

Dance helps children improve coordination, fitness, and foster an incredible sense of emotional well-being. In these lessons' children will enjoy learning dances in a variety of styles including Street, Commercial Pop and Contemporary.

Drama is an essential skill to take with you wherever you go, learning about social interactions and working as part of a team. Children develop self-awareness and confidence whilst exploring Drama techniques such as Improvisation, Mime, Script Work & Plays. Follow the instructions to set up your payment details and sign up for auto pay. This will simplify the payment process for you.

After setting up auto pay, you can select the "Talbot Primary School - Theatre Kidz" option to enrol your child in Theatre Kidz.

- **The cost:** The cost for Theatre Kidz is £37.00 per month, automatically charged on the 7th of each month. Payments are prorated and spread across the year, ensuring that your child will receive the correct number of Theatre Kidz classes for the rest of the school year. The fee works out to approximately £5.75 per hour.

Please note that payments are collected each month (on the 7th), excluding August. **If you decide to cancel your child's place at any time, the monthly payment will be terminated accordingly.**

If a class is cancelled we can add another class at the end of the term/school year or we add a credit to your account.

- **What to bring:** Please send your son or daughter with a drink & a snack (no nut products please) and inform their class teacher they are coming along.

TALBOT PRIMARY SCHOOL WEDNESDAY 5:00PM-6:00

The Southern Karate Association teaches traditional karate based on the principles of Wado Ryu karate in schools to children of all ages and abilities. Classes are led by professional instructors with enhanced DBS certificates, first aid training and full professional insurance. In class children will learn karate, developing discipline, self-control, fitness in a fun and safe environment.

Classes cost £6.00 per session. Classes normally paid half termly but can be paid weekly for the first few weeks. Details of payment arrangements will be available from the instructor.

Please be aware that it is a legal requirement that all students have insurance/licence to train in karate which will cost £25 per year. Information on this will be available from the instructor. If you would like your child to continue with us the insurance/licence must be completed online within the first 4 weeks.

The class is open to all year groups.

Please ensure children have a PE kit or similar clothing and a drink for the session.
